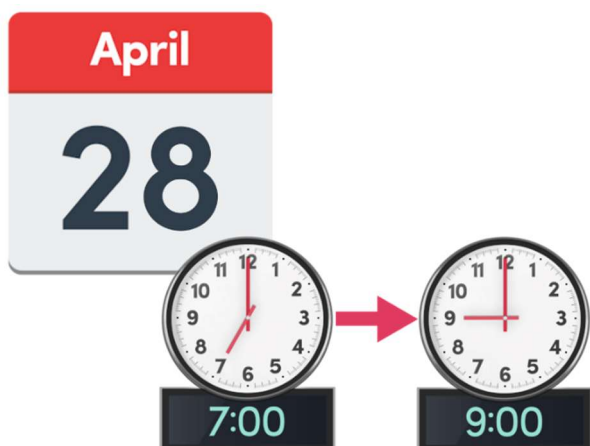


Ask the next Mayor of Bristol your questions!

There will also **candidates** who want to be the next Mayor of Bristol.

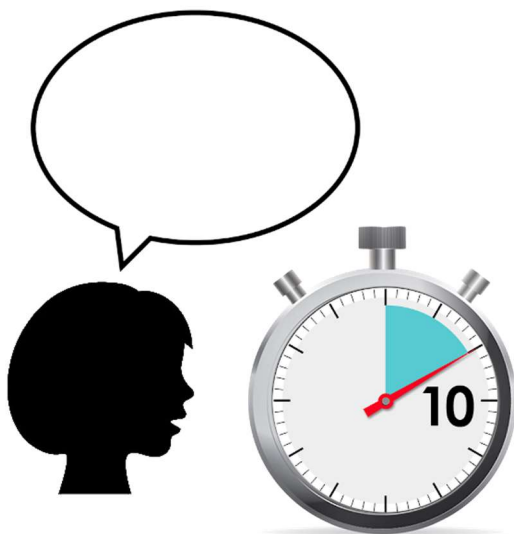
They are from four political parties:

The candidate that gets the most votes at the election on Thursday 6 May 2021, will be the new Mayor.



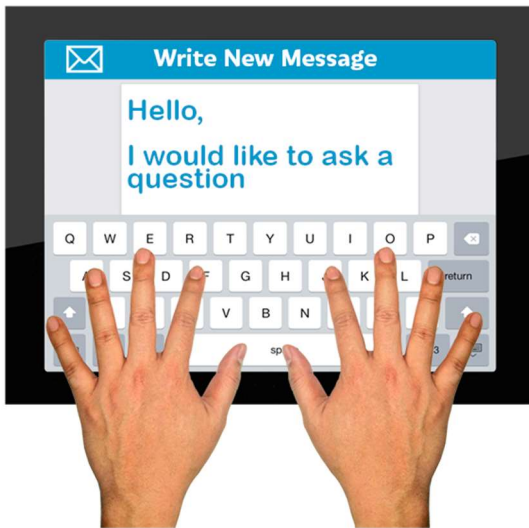
At the meeting each candidate will talk for 10 minutes.
